Can I study my subject at the University of Münster?

Can I study in Germany with my educational background?

If you want to study in Germany, you need to have a University Entrance Qualification. The University Entrance Qualification refers to academic credentials, such as a school-leaving certificate or, in some cases, a combination of a school-leaving certificate and a period of study/a preparatory year. The database of the [German Academic Exchange Service \(DAAD\)](#) provides you with country-specific information.

Do I have sufficient language skills?

The majority of the degree programmes at the University of Münster are taught in German. To gain admission to a German-taught degree programme, you need to have very good German language skills. Please familiarize yourself with the [language requirements](#) and our preparatory [German language course](#) before applying. The language requirements for our English-taught degree programmes can be found directly on the respective degree programme websites.

What deadlines should I be aware of?

Different [deadlines](#) apply to different programmes and applicants. We only accept applications during the application period. In our [Study Guide](#) you can find out whether your desired degree programme can be started in the winter and/or in the summer semester.

How do I apply?

At the University of Münster, you apply for admission online. Here you will find all information on applying for [Bachelor's and State Examination programmes](#) as well as for [Master's programmes](#).

How long do I have to wait for an acceptance or rejection?

You can track the status of your application in our [Info Portal](#). At the end of your application, you will receive your log in information. Please check the status of your application at least twice a week. The letters of rejection and acceptance will be sent 6-8 weeks after the application deadline.

What else do I need to consider?



Studying in Germany involves some costs. Unlike in other countries, scholarships are not common in Germany. Please clarify your study financing in advance.

Many international students need a study visa. Please visit the website of the German Embassy in your country to find out whether you need a visa to enter and study in Germany as early as possible.
